Construction Date: This home first appears in the City Directory in 1916.

Architectural Style/Features: This two and one-half storey hipped roof home clad in red brick with selective use of wood, has a projecting off-centre bay with an eye-brow roofed veranda sheltering the left of centre entry. The roof is supported by several, light classical columns on waist level brick walls. Immediate above the entry porch is a recessed but open balcony under the main roof and it is surrounded by decorative solid woodwork with an arched opening on two sides. There is an eyebrow roof dormer facing the street (note the use of pillars similar in style to those of the porch) and another to the left but on the right side of the roof is a much larger hipped roof dormer that extents out to the edge of a large two-level projecting square bay. There is an attractive brick buttress with stone inserts on both sides of the front façade. Note the interesting wood detailing on the soffits. Most windows appear original and are typically two or three over one sash windows of varying size and groupings. The wood entry door has a large central light and wide transom window above the door and two side lights. The main bay windows are supported from below by a heavy stone band which is repeated at the top of the veranda wall and also on top of two curved walls bordering the entry stairs to the porch.
